**NOTICE OF CONTRAVENTION**

This letter is to inform the 1619936 Ontario Inc. o/a A One Windsor Truck Driving School that on 02/12/2009, it was determined that 1619936 Ontario Inc. o/a A One Windsor Truck Driving School contravened the following section of the *Private Career Colleges Act, 2005* and/or regulations made under the Act:

- Failure to comply with an order of the Superintendent made under s. 46 of the Act

As per section 51 of *Ontario Regulation 415/06* made under the *Private Career Colleges Act, 2005*, 1619936 Ontario Inc. o/a A One Windsor Truck Driving School is subject to a penalty in the total amount of \$1,000 per day. It is important to note that the penalty is levied daily. The total penalty amount is calculated by multiplying the penalty amount indicated above by the number of successive days that the contravention continues.

*For example: following 5 successive days that the contravention continues the penalty amount due will be \$5,000.*

*following 15 successive days that the contravention continues the penalty amount due will be \$15,000.*

At this time you are required to provide the ministry with written confirmation of compliance with the Act.

Please supply the ministry with the following documents confirming that you have come into compliance with the Act:

- written confirmation signed by a person with authority to bind the school, together with all available supporting evidence, that the steps outlined below have been taken:
  - has stopped operating;
  - has stopped enrolling students;
  - has stopped advertising;
  - has issued refunds to students who were enrolled in unapproved vocational programs if required under section 25 of Ontario Regulation 415/06; and

- will not reopen at all, OR
- will not reopen until and unless it is properly registered as a private career college and has obtained approval for all vocational programs as required under the PCCA, 2005.

If 1619936 Ontario Inc. o/a A One Windsor Truck Driving School proposes to offer vocational programs, it may only do so after the school is registered and its vocational programs are approved by the Superintendent. You must apply for registration and approval by doing the following:

- Submit completed online applications for registration of a private career college and for approval of all vocational programs as listed in Schedule A.
- Submit required hard copy documents for the application for registration of a private career college and for approval of all vocational programs.
- Submit a list including the names and addresses of all current and former students;
- Confirm that 1619936 Ontario Inc. o/a A One Windsor Truck Driving School is not holding, directly or indirectly, any monies owing to current, former, or prospective students of unapproved vocational programs;
- Confirm that 1619936 Ontario Inc. o/a A One Windsor Truck Driving School is holding student files, and sets out a date and time when files will be made available for the Superintendent's staff to review; and
- Explain in writing why 1619936 Ontario Inc. o/a A One Windsor Truck Driving School was offering, and enrolling students in, vocational programs prior to obtaining approval of those programs from and prior to registration of A One by the Superintendent.

Once you have confirmed compliance with the Act, the penalties will cease to accumulate and the ministry will notify you of the total penalty outstanding. Payment of the full amount is due within **30 days** of the date of your notification.

If payment is not received within **30 days** after the date the notice of contravention was received, the amount will be subject to interest at the current post-judgment interest rate beginning on the 31<sup>st</sup> day following the date of notice. ### **Review**

If you believe that the decision made above is inaccurate you may request a review of this decision by submitting a Request for a Review of a Notice of Contravention form to the Minister of Training, Colleges and Universities within **15 days** of receipt of the Notice of Contravention.
