

Particulars of a Restraining Order

S. 49 (2) Private Career Colleges Act, 2005 ("Act")

These particulars are posted following the issuance of a Restraining Order against an unregistered private career college by the Superintendent of Private Career Colleges pursuant to s. 46 (2) of the Act.

Contraventions

The Superintendent has ordered APICS Toronto Chapter to stop:

- Operating a private career college ("PCC") contrary to s. 7 of the Act;
- Offering or providing an unapproved vocational program contrary to s. 8 (1) of the Act;
- Charging or collecting a fee for an unapproved vocational program contrary to s. 9 (1) of the Act; and
- Advertising an unregistered PCC and an unapproved vocational program contrary to s. 11 of the Act.

Required Actions

By April 15, 2013, APICS Toronto Chapter is required by the Superintendent to provide written confirmation signed by a person with authority to bind the corporation, together with all available supporting evidence, confirming that they:

- A. Have stopped operating a PCC;

- B. Have stopped offering or providing an unapproved vocational program, namely the Certified in Production & Inventory Management (“CPIM”) program;
- C. Have stopped charging or collecting a fee for an unapproved vocational program, namely the CPIM program; and
- D. Have stopped advertising an unregistered PCC and an unapproved vocational program, namely the CPIM program.

Note: Nothing in this Order prevents APICS Toronto Chapter from providing the non-vocational Certified Supply Chain Professional program to the public.
