

Particulars of Notice of Contravention and Review Decision

S. 49(1) *Private Career Colleges Act, 2005* (“Act”)

Friday March 25, 2011

These particulars are posted following the issuance of an administrative penalty for which a review was requested. Penalties may be reviewed upon request within 15 days of receipt of a Notice of Contravention. The review decision is made considering not only the information originally available at the time the Notice of Contravention was issued, but also any new information not previously available that may have been supplied in support of the request for a review. On review, an administrative penalty may be upheld, rescinded or reduced. A review decision is final.

<p>Act, s. 7 — Prohibition against operating a private career college</p> <p>On November 25, 2010, a Designate of the Superintendent telephoned the number (416-417-7345) listed on both internet advertisements for the school and spoke to Muhammad Bilal, who identified himself as the owner of the school and confirmed that the Designate had called “Aun Truck Training Centre.”</p> <p>Mr. Bilal advised the Designate that they taught an AZ program for unlimited road tests and unlimited road lessons at a cost of \$3,000. He stated that the program takes five to six weeks to complete at a duration of four days per week from Monday to Thursday for a maximum of one hour per day in the truck. He also told the Designate that if cash is paid for the program, the price is \$3,000. If a method other than cash is used to pay for the program, H.S.T. must be paid. Mr. Bilal mentioned that classes could be started right away. AZ truck training corresponds to National Occupational Classification (NOC) code 7411 –Truck Drivers. Under subsection 7(2) of the Act, no person shall hold themselves out as the operator of a private career college unless the person is registered.
