This is a **Restraining Order** issued under the authority of section 46 of the Private Career Colleges Act, 2005 (PCCA, 2005). As the Superintendent of Private Career Colleges, I HEREBY ORDER CanPacific College of Business and English Inc. o/a CanPacific College of Business (CanPacific College) TO STOP OPERATING IN CONTRAVENTION OF THE PRIVATE CAREER COLLEGES ACT, 2005 (PCCA, 2005).

The detailed reasons supporting my order are set out in Schedule A, attached. In brief CanPacific College is advertising an unregistered private career college and advertising unapproved vocational programs, contrary to subsections 11(1) and (2) of that Act, respectively.

CanPacific College must provide written confirmation signed by a person with authority to bind the school, together with all available supporting evidence, that the steps outlined below have been taken. This written confirmation must be delivered **immediately** by registered mail or courier to my attention and confirm that CanPacific College:

- has stopped advertising unapproved vocational programs and has stopped advertising an unregistered Private Career College in Ontario including removal of all references to vocational programs on the website <http://www.canpacificcollege.com/>.

If CanPacific College is currently providing unapproved vocational programs as an unregistered Private Career College, these actions would be contrary to sections 7 and 8 of the PCCA, 2005 respectively. CanPacific College would then be required to **immediately** take the steps outlined below in this order to comply with the PCCA, 2005. Specifically, CanPacific College:

1. must stop operating as a private career college;
2. must stop providing unapproved vocational programs;
3. must stop enrolling students in unapproved vocational programs;
4. must provide the ministry with a list including the names and addresses of all current and former students;
5. must provide refunds to students who were enrolled in unapproved vocational programs;
6. must not hold, directly or indirectly, any monies owing to current, former, or prospective students of unapproved vocational programs;
7. must hold student files to be available for the Superintendent's staff to review; and
8. must not reopen until such time, if any, as it is registered.

Consequences of Failure to Comply with this Order

Failure to comply with this order may result in any or all of the following actions by the Superintendent:

1. Application for a court order from the Superior Court of Justice to compel CanPacific College to comply;
2. The issuance of further Administrative Monetary Penalties.
3. Prosecution for the offence of failure to comply. Upon conviction by a court of that offence, a corporation is subject to a fine of up to \$100,000; an individual, including an officer or director of a corporation who concurs in the commission of the offence, is subject to a fine of up to \$25,000, a prison term of up to one year, or both.

Schedule A – Detailed Reasons for Decision

Contravention of section 11 of the PCCA, 2005 – Advertising Unregistered Private Career College and Unapproved Programs

On January 13, 2010 ministry staff examined the website of CanPacific College of Business and English Inc. o/a CanPacific College of Business and English (CanPacific) <http://www.canpacificcollege.com/>. The site describes the following programs:

- Executive Assistant Certificate program at a cost of \$4,150 (\$4,750 with internship) for 240 hours (480 with internship) of instruction.
- Introduction to Interpretation and Translation at a cost of \$1,490 for 100 hours of instruction.
- Diploma of Interpretation and Translation
 - English and Japanese Certificate at a cost of \$1,390 for 100 hours of instruction.
 - English and Japanese Diploma at a cost of \$2,610 for 200 hours of instruction.
 - English and Spanish Certificate at a cost of \$1,111 for 100 hours of instruction.
 - English and Spanish Diploma at a cost of \$2,070 for 200 hours of instruction.

According to the description provided on the website, all of the preceding programs fit the definition of a vocational program according to the PCCA, 2005. Therefore the school is contravening the PCCA, 2005 by advertising unregistered vocational programs and therefore advertising itself as a Private Career College.

Legal and Operating Entities

A corporate search showed CanPacific College of Business and English Inc. as a registered corporation in Ontario and CanPacific College of Business and English to be a registered business name. Akram (Adam) Arezo is listed as the sole director of the corporation and the corporate address is listed as 44 Breckonwood Crescent, Thornhill Ontario, L3T 5E8.
