**Re: Notice Revocation of Vocational Program Approval - Section 24 of the Private Career Colleges Act, 2005**

I am advised that Canadian All Care Inc. o/a Canadian All Care College ("Canadian All Care") is not operating in compliance with the Private Career Colleges Act, 2005 ( the "PCCA,2005") and the regulations made thereunder.

**This letter serves as notice of my intention to revoke Canadian All Care's approval to provide the Pharmacy Technician Program for failing to meet the conditions of the approval. This revocation is issued pursuant to my authority under Section 24 of the PCCA, 2005 and is effective as of April 3, 2008.**

**PARTICULARS OF CONTRAVENTION/FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH PCCA, 2005**

I am advised that Canadian All Care has made a substantial change to the Pharmacy Technician Program without obtaining the Superintendent's approval of the change in contravention of paragraph 6 of subsection 23 (1) of the PCCA, 2005. During the inspection of Canadian All Care on January 29, 2008, the inspector observed and noted that Canadian All Care College has not maintained the required laboratory facility with the appropriate equipment and supplies to provide instruction in the Pharmacy Technician Program. When the inspector asked to see the Pharmacy Technician teaching laboratory facility he was shown a cabinet containing some supplies in the same classroom that is used to deliver instruction for most of the schools approved programs.

Pursuant to paragraph 6 of subsection 23 (1) of the PCCA, 2005 a private career college is prohibited from making substantial change to a vocational program that it has been approved to provide without the further approval of the Superintendent. A substantial change is defined in

subsection 13 (1) of O. Reg. 414/06 and includes a reduction or loss of equipment, facilities and learning resources.

Please refer to Dr. Zubin Austin's Facility Inspection Report, dated December 21, 2005 and Pharmacy Technician Program Equipment and Supplies Checklist for the requirements of an approved laboratory facility, equipment and supplies for the approved Pharmacy Technician Program. I have attached a copy of both documents for your review.

I am further advised that presently there are no students enrolled in the Pharmacy Technician Program at Canadian All Care College.

In order to obtain approval for the Pharmacy Technician Program, you will be required to submit an Application for Program Approval and a positive third-party assessment from Dr Zubin Austin for the Pharmacy Technician facility.

Canadian All Care will deliver to me by registered mail or courier no later than **Tuesday, April 10, 2008** a written confirmation signed by an authorized officer or other official of Canadian All Care College confirming that Canadian All Care has ceased offering, advertising, charging or collecting fees, and issuing credentials for the Pharmacy Technician Program.
