

**Particulars of Notice of Contravention and Review Decision**

These particulars are posted following the issuance of an administrative penalty for which a review was requested. Penalties may be reviewed upon request within 15 days of receipt of a Notice of Contravention. The review decision is made considering not only the information originally available at the time the Notice of Contravention was issued, but also any new information not previously available that may have been supplied in support of the request for a review. On review, an administrative penalty may be upheld, rescinded or reduced. A review decision is final.

<p>PCCA, 2005 s. 11 - Restrictions on advertising and soliciting.</p> <p>On April 14, 2010, the website belonging to Canadian Trucking Academy ("School"), <a href="http://www.canadiantruckingacademy.com">http://www.canadiantruckingacademy.com</a> was reviewed by a Designate who found it advertising commercial truck driving programs ranging from 25 to 200 hours in duration. On the same day, the Designate phoned and spoke with Dominique Cadieux about the AZ course. He advised that it is 40 hours in length, and costs \$3,000. This course corresponds to National Occupational Classification (NOC) code 7411 – Other Truck Drivers, and is therefore a vocational program within the meaning of the Private Career Colleges Act, 2005 ("Act") and is required to be approved by the Superintendent pursuant to section 23 of the Act. The School was previously a registered Private Career College, and was registered on August 15, 2006. The school's registration was voluntarily withdrawn on November 11, 2007. That previous registration included approval to deliver a Tractor Trailer (AZ) Driving Program.</p>	<p>\$1,000 per day</p>	<p>Penalty of \$1,000 per day is reduced to \$250 per day for the period of May 10, 2010 to May 17, 2010 (inclusive).</p> <p>The balance of evidence available indicates that Canadian Trucking Academy was advertising an unapproved vocational program. Canadian Trucking Academy came into compliance on May 17, 2010 by discontinuing all advertising of an unapproved vocational program.</p>
