**NOTICE OF CONTRAVENTION**

This letter is to inform you, as President of 1090014 Ontario Ltd. o/a McDonald Professional Training Institute ("MPTI"), that on December 30, 2009, it was determined that MPTI contravened the following section of the *Private Career Colleges Act, 2005* (PCCA, 2005) and/or of regulations made under the Act:

- Act, s. 11 – Restrictions on advertising and soliciting (\$1,000)

For a Summary of each contravention, see attached Schedule A.

As per section 51 of *Ontario Regulation 415/06* made under the *Private Career Colleges Act, 2005*, McDonald Professional Training Institute is subject to a penalty in the total amount of \$1,000 per day. It is important to note that the penalty is levied daily. The total penalty amount is calculated by multiplying the penalty amount indicated above by the number of successive days that the contravention continues.

*For example: following 5 successive days that the contravention continues the penalty amount due will be \$5,000.*

*following 15 successive days that the contravention continues the penalty amount due will be \$15,000.*

At this time you are required to provide the ministry with written confirmation of compliance with the *Private Career Colleges Act, 2005* and its regulations. Please supply the ministry with the following documents confirming that you have come into compliance with the Act:

- Written confirmation that misleading advertising regarding the Personal Support Worker Program has been removed

Once you have confirmed compliance with the Act, the penalties will cease to accumulate and the ministry will notify you of the total penalty outstanding. Payment of the full amount is due within **30 days** of the date of your notification.

If payment is not received within **30 days** after the date the notice of contravention was received, the amount will be subject to interest at the current post-judgment interest rate beginning on the 31<sup>st</sup> day following the date of notice. ## Review

If you believe that the decision made above is inaccurate you may request a review of this decision by submitting a Request for a Review of a Notice of Contravention form to the Minister of Training, Colleges and Universities within **15 days** of receipt of the Notice of Contravention.

## Schedule A

Act, s. 11 – Restrictions on advertising and soliciting

- MPTI was found to have misleading advertising at 5 Park Home Avenue, Unit 128, Toronto, Ontario, on December 30, 2009, stating that they were offering “Personal Support Worker Program”, which is not an approved vocational program. MPTI is also not a registered private career college.
