

Particulars of Notice of Contravention and Review Decision
S. 49(1) *Private Career Colleges Act, 2005* (“Act”)

September 8, 2011

These particulars are posted following the issuance of an administrative penalty for which a review was requested. Penalties may be reviewed upon request within 15 days of receipt of a Notice of Contravention. The review decision is made considering not only the information originally available at the time the Notice of Contravention was issued, but also any new information not previously available that may have been supplied in support of the request for a review. On review, an administrative penalty may be upheld, rescinded or reduced. A review decision is final.

<p>Act, s. 11 – Restrictions on advertising and soliciting</p> <p>Written communications between the Director of the School and former students between May 18 and May 19, 2011 led the Designate to the reasonable belief that section 11(3) of the Act had been contravened.</p> <p>This School is not registered as a private career college and has not had its programs approved. Therefore they are prohibited from soliciting students to enrol in vocational programs.</p>	<p>Daily Penalty of \$1,000</p>	<p>Penalty of \$1,000 per day is upheld for the period of May 25, 2011 to May 27, 2011 (inclusive).</p> <p>The balance of evidence available indicates that 2166807 Ontario Inc. was soliciting students to enrol in an unapproved vocational program.</p> <p>2166807 Ontario Inc. came into compliance on May 27, 2011.</p>
<p>Act, s. 7 – Prohibition against operating a private career college</p> <p>The Director of the School advised a former student that the School had completed their registration application and that the School was registered as a private career college and that they could offer the student additional classes and issue the student a new certificate.</p> <p>Therefore, the Designate came to the reasonable belief that the School was holding itself out as the operator of a private career college without being registered, in contravention of section 7(2) of the Act.</p>	<p>Daily Penalty of \$1,000</p>	<p>Penalty of \$1,000 per day is upheld for the period of May 25, 2011 to May 27, 2011 (inclusive).</p> <p>The balance of evidence available indicates that 2166807 Ontario Inc. was holding itself out as an operator of a private career college without being registered.</p> <p>2166807 Ontario Inc. came into compliance on May 27, 2011.</p>

Failure to comply with an order of the Superintendent made under s. 46 of the Act	Daily Penalty of \$1,000	Penalty is rescinded.
