

**Particulars of Notice of Contravention and Review Decision**  
S. 49(1) *Private Career Colleges Act, 2005*

These particulars are posted following the issuance of an administrative penalty for which a review was requested. Penalties may be reviewed upon request within 15 days of receipt of a Notice of Contravention. The review decision is made considering not only the information originally available at the time the Notice of Contravention was issued, but also any new information not previously available that may have been supplied in support of the request for a review. On review, an administrative penalty may be upheld, rescinded or reduced. A review decision is final.

<p>O.Reg 415/06, s. 44 – Prohibition against charging fees for a program in a currency other than Canadian dollars (\$750)</p> <p>On its website, Pampered Paws Limited provides a list of its programs and corresponding tuition fees. The heading for the fees is entitled “Canadian Citizen Out of Country US Dollars Apply.” Further down in the same section of the website, it states “As of May 1, 2008. Canadian citizens: All fees are in Canadian dollars, all other Countries pay in US dollars.”</p>	<p>\$750 per day</p>	<p>Penalty of \$750 per day is upheld. The penalty accumulated from January 25, 2010 to February 3, 2010 (inclusive).</p> <p>The balance of evidence available indicates the PCC was charging fees in a currency other than Canadian dollars. The PCC has come into compliance and ceased delivering the programs at issue in the Notice of Contravention.</p>
